Bar Council (BC) pension fund

Richard Salter QC is chairing a Bar Council group to examine all options for dealing with accruing pension fund liabilities. Consultants Bluefin are assisting the group which is due to make a report at the Bar Council meeting on 12.3.11. BACFI has been campaigning hard to ensure that the option of closing the scheme as a defined benefit scheme and moving to a defined contribution scheme (thus reducing future accruals) is properly examined and that decisions are not made behind closed doors.

BACFI will continue to lobby for greater transparency in BC governance.

BACFI met Dr Vanessa Davies, the **new Chief Executive of the Bar Standards Board (BSB)** on 26.1.11. Dr Davies has kindly agreed to speak at our Legal Practice Forum on June 30th and will be attending the Amity Supper.

Bar Standards Board appointments: Vanessa is keen to have more CFI Barristers on the BSB's committees and she wants hard rather than anecdotal evidence as to why we do not apply. Vacancies have just been advertised and even with an extended return date, the response has been disappointing. What is it that deters us from applying for BSB appointments, when we always seem to get plenty of interest in Bar Council vacancies? It is really in our interest to have fellow employed barristers playing a direct part of the regulatory process and shaping the Bar for the future.

Education

New Practitioners' Programme Advocacy and Ethics Training: Further NPP training courses tailored to the needs of the employed bar will be held, we hope, by all four Inns during the spring of 2011. We shall be holding our popular **Ethics Roundtable** again on July 20th. **CPD seminars:** BACFI remains an accredited provider of CPD seminars and we will be ensuring that each event in our programme (below) carries points. BACFI has been lobbying for

a simpler, self-accreditation system for CPD that recognizes the need for soft skills and reflects the requirements of the employed bar.

• Support

Pupillages: are down from 460 to 402 this year and there are still very few EB Pupillage Training Organisations (PTOs). The BSB has 3 or 4 applications pending and **we would like to hear from anyone whose firm has applied**, so that we can continue to monitor the difficulties. Contact hfrogers@bacfi.org.

Student Health warnings: BACFI has been lobbying both the BSB and the Inns to ensure that students are kept properly informed of the difficulties of securing pupillage and the consequences of failing to complete their professional training. We do not consider that the current "health warnings" are sufficiently robust when students are incurring such enormous debts during their academic training, and the QLTT fall back has now been closed. BACFI gives annual student talks and is forming a focus group to cover pupillage issues generally.
