Our thanks to Middle Temple which laid on an excellent spread for the Supper.

BACFI's **first out of London seminar** (on the new Bribery Act 2010) was held on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May at St Philips Chambers, Birmingham. Several members of the Midlands C&I committee attended, and we will be discussing future possibilities for seminars with them. Our thanks go to St Philips for their generous hospitality and we hope to see members of chambers at future BACFI events.

#### *In memoriam*

We have sent our condolences to the family of **Peter Cottis**, a founder member of BACFI, and one of our honorary members, who died on March 21<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Bar Council (BC) pension fund**

The first proper debate on the 3 options for dealing with the BC pension scheme and fund, identified by Richard Salter QC's group at the end of last year, was held at Bar Council on 14<sup>th</sup> May. It was lively and lasted about an hour. Bluefin representatives attended the meeting and

answered questions. Most aspects and Qs were covered, including as much about costs as humanly possible.

Unfortunately the vote came late in the morning, after a good hour had been spent on CPS Panel arrangements and many members had left; but 45 members voted to continue the DB scheme, simply *in order to allow negotiations with staff and the Trustees*. Only 12 members voted to close the scheme with immediate effect.

In fact closure will remain on the table throughout negotiations, which will aim to secure a) consent to scheme changes b) higher employee contributions and lower BC ones and c) a more aggressive investment strategy for the fund.

BACFI's hard work over the last year to ensure that a full debate was held and that costed options were thoroughly aired has finally paid off. BACFI will of course continue to lobby for greater transparency in other areas of BC governance.

BACFI met the Chief Counsel and press officer of **Legal Services Board (LSB)** in April. We expressed our concerns about Bar Council transparency, the plight of non-practising barristers and the forthcoming Legal Education Review.

**CPD seminars:** BACFI remains an accredited provider of CPD seminars and we will be ensuring that each event in our programme (below) carries points. BACFI has been lobbying for a simpler, self-accreditation system for CPD that recognizes the need for soft skills and reflects the requirements of the employed bar.

- **Support**

**Pupillages:** are down from 460 to 402 this year and there are still very few EB Pupillage Training Organisations (PTOs). The BSB has 3 or 4 applications pending and **we would like to hear from anyone whose firm has applied**, so that we can continue to monitor the difficulties. **Student Health warnings:** BACFI has been lobbying both the BSB and the Inns to ensure that students are kept properly informed of the difficulties of securing pupillage and the consequences of failing to complete their professional training. We do not consider that the current “health warnings” are sufficiently robust when students are incurring such enormous debts during their academic training, and the QLTT fall back has now been closed. BACFI gives annual student talks and is forming a focus group to cover pupillage issues generally.
