Scholarships Trust

The Inn continues to raise funds for <u>The Bingham Scholarships Appeal</u> which now exceeds £620k The Inn has a dedicated web-page giving details on how you can donate either by cheque or standing order – it couldn't be easier! Library

Responding to popular demand from members, Lawtel is again available via the Library's computers. The service is particularly valued for its up-to-date case reporting and PI Quantum materials.

Our flagship international law collection boasts two notable additions. The International Law Reports online provide fully searchable access to 100 years of public international law decisions, while the Max Planck Encyclopedia of Public International Law is the authoritative reference work in the field.

An attractive and informative display on the life of Master Sir John Holker can be found in the central aisle of the Library. Bencher and Treasurer of the Inn, it was the Holker bequest that funded the building of the "greatly enlarged and beautified" Library in 1929. A Guide collecting pictures, articles and memoir has also been compiled.
