A New Hall Lunch Offer

From **24** April, the Hall lunch menu will be refreshed with the following changes being introduced:

There will be 3 main meal choices daily including a Bistro style 'dish of the day', with vegetables, at £6.50 providing a lunch menu to suit every budget.

- The popular Carvery will be available on each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday during Term.
- There will be additional 'one off' special dishes (please note a supplement may be charged).
- The salad bar will be revised with two special salads of the day and an accompanying range of simple salads and protein items to create a daily-changing range of fresh salads for every taste.
- A dessert of the day along with seasonal fresh fruit and cheese platters will be available to add a 'final finish' to your meal.

Student Discount

All Gray's Inn Students will benefit from a 20% discount for lunch on the production at the till of a Gray's Inn Student Member Card.

<u>19/21 High Holborn – Re-development</u>

We are delighted to announce that on 23 February the Inn was granted planning consent for the extension and refurbishment of 19/21 High Holborn. The detailed design stage is now progressing along with tendering for a construction contractor. In addition to work to the building itself the project will allow us to improve the main entrance from High Holborn and the Paddock. We are targeting a start date of October this year with completion expected in early 2019.

There will be periods after October 2017, until completion of the work at the end of 2018, when the High Holborn entrance will be closed to traffic (but open to pedestrians) and the Gray's Inn Square access will most likely operate using a traffic light system. Details of access and traffic flow measures will follow in due course.

<u>Library</u>

The Library's Intranet homepage has been completely re-designed and updated giving Members a smoother, cleaner interface when accessing online services. Of particular note is the new Legal Updates page, featuring the latest legal updates provided by Lawtel across a range of subjects, including human rights and personal injury.

Notably strengthening our key international law coverage, the <u>HeinOnline International database</u> has been added to our online services, making available the World Treaty Library, World Constitutions Illustrated, Foreign and International Law Resources Database and the United Nations Law Collection. Also included is the Law Journal Library, containing probably the single largest online collection of UK and overseas legal journals.

The New Books wall (opposite the photocopiers) boasts new editions of Shaw's International Law, Wells' Abuse of Process and an examination of The Human Rights Based Approach to Carbon Finance.

Members can sign up to receive the <u>Library Bulletin</u>, which is issued periodically to keep Library users up to date with current opening hours, services and events. Previous bulletins can be accessed through the <u>Library Bulletin Archive</u>.
