

<u>Gray's Inn Quarterly Update – What's On</u>

Vehicle Access/Exit

During the work on One Gray's Inn (formerly 19/21 High Holborn) there will be <u>no vehicle access</u> from High Holborn nor into the Paddock (except for construction vehicles). Vehicle entrance/exit into Gray's Inn Square and South Square will be from Gray's Inn Road. Please note that traffic around Gray's Inn Square will move anti-clockwise.

Car Parking

Following the start of works at One Gray's Inn (formerly 19/21 High Holborn) the vehicular access from High Holborn has been closed. However, the <u>car parking</u> in both South Square and Gray's Inn Square remains available with access and egress via Gray's Inn Road. Daily car parking is available at a cost of £20 per day and there is no need to prebook. The cost of annual parking permits, renewable on 1st January 2018, has been held for a further year at £2,760 per annum. Annual permits are available for the remainder of the year on a pro-rata basis. Pedestrian Access

Please note that for reasons of safety due to the movement of two-way traffic through the Gray's Inn Road entrance/exit no pedestrian use of this entrance/exit will be permitted. Similarly, no pedestrian access via the Paddock will be permitted as it will be used for construction vehicles. This arrangement will remain in place until the vehicular access from High Holborn re-opens in 2019. However, by the time this update is circulated the pedestrian access adjacent to the Cittie of Yorke will have re-opened. It will need to close again at certain stages of the development but is likely to remain open now for at least a month and future closures will be well publicised.

Electric Vehicle Charging Posts

There are now a number of electric vehicle charging posts at locations throughout the Inn. Take up of this opportunity has been good. Spaces are available only to annual permit holders and a small number remain available. Library

The Library has now taken possession of the Lauterpacht Collection of international law, bequeathed by the late Master Elihu Lauterpacht. Consisting of Master Lauterpacht's personal library, the Collection is made up of books, journals, law reports, pamphlets, off-prints, government publications and conference proceedings, all relating to international law. Currently stored in boxes in the Library's closed stack, the sorting and cataloguing of the Collection will be a major project. This is however a significant new acquisition for the Library and an important supplement to its flagship international law collection.

Remote access to <u>Bloomsbury Professional Online</u> has been made available for has been made available for up to 300 members of Gray's Inn. The service provides full-text access to materials in 20 practice areas including, company and commercial, employment, environment, family, local government, property and personal injury. Currently displayed on the <u>New Books</u> wall (opposite the photocopiers) are titles including <u>Mance on Privy Council</u> <u>Practice</u>, <u>Football and the Law</u> and <u>The Secret Barrister</u>: Stories of the Law and How it's Broken.

New power points have been installed in The North Library allowing members to plug in their laptops and mobile devices and bringing the space into line with facilities throughout the rest of the Library.

Subject Guides covering eight of the Library's specialisms have been launched in hardcopy and <u>online</u>. The Guides highlight key textbooks, journals and reports and list useful organisations and free internet resources.

Members can sign up to receive the <u>Library Bulletin</u>, to keep up to date with current opening hours, services and events. Previous bulletins can be accessed through the <u>Library Bulletin Archive</u>. Rolling Library news and information is also published via the Inn's <u>Twitter</u> and <u>Facebook</u> accounts.

As ever, <u>our Document Supply</u> and <u>Remote Enquiry</u> services are available for members who are unable to visit the Library in person, particularly those outside London. Full details can be found on our <u>webpages</u>.

Archives

The past six months have been dominated by GDPR. The archive staff, whose responsibilities include responding to Subject Access Requests, have prepared for GDPR implementation by (among other things) re-appraising, re-listing and where appropriate reducing the hard-copy archives, to improve access to data. The Inn's digital records, although managed differently, have been logged and brought into the overall retention system, and rendered more easily searchable. The Data Controller / Director of Finance is overseeing the preparation of the Data Asset Register. The next few months will make clear the impact of the new Regulation.

Besides this, the normal work of the archives continues: research enquiries are particularly focussed at present on the early years of women at the Bar. Regarding the picture collection, we have just had a spectroscopic examination carried out of the portrait of Elizabeth I, with interesting results.

Chapel

We began Trinity Term with Mattins on June 17th, and again on July 15th. Between them it's Festive Mattins on Sunday July 8th, which is followed by a "picnic" Lunch in the Walks: lunch tickets @ £35 need to be booked in advance from the Administrative & Events Officer in the Treasury Office.

Holy Communion will be celebrated at 6pm on Monday June 11th, and Tuesday July 3rd, and October 2nd. This is a half-hour service to which everyone is welcome.

We have two weddings in Chapel this term, two more after the summer break, and also in September the Blessing of the marriage of Philip Craig, our Butler in Hall, who is marrying Clare in a Salvation Army service in August.

Next term starts up with Mattins on Sunday October 7th and a special welcome to the students who will be here for their Introductory Weekend. Evensong will be sung at 6pm on Tuesday October 23rd.

Our series of Summer Concerts is underway. On Tuesday June 19th Christopher Bowers-Broadbent show-cases Organ Music by Schumann and Bach, and the final concert on June 26th is by the St Paul's Quartet. Even if it's too late to book for the Supper which follows, the concerts, like all events in Chapel are free, open to the public, and tickers are not needed.
