

GRAY'S INN QUARTERLY UPDATE - WHAT'S ON

These quarterly updates are e-mailed to everyone on the Inn's database who has indicated they wish to receive them. This is the **second** update of 2020. I would be most grateful if you would keep your contact details up-to-date by visiting the <u>Gray's Inn Online System</u> (GIOS) to confirm your details and update your contact preferences. This is particularly important due to the General Data Protection Regulation which came into effect on 25th May 2018.

Update on COVID-19

Since the publication of the last report, the Inn has been run by staff who are working both from the office and also from home. The Inn is now moving into a new phase where most staff that were furloughed have now returned to work. The Treasury Reception is now open between the hours of 10:00am – 4:30pm. In addition, the Library which had been running a remote service during lockdown, re-opened to members in mid-July. The overnight accommodation at the Inn has re-opened and bookings for this can be made via the Inn's website. More details on the overnight accommodation can be found here. Developments on COVID-19 are continually monitored by the Inn and the Inn's response to these will be updated via the Gray's website and our social media. The safety of our members, staff and visitors remains the Inn's top priority and we remind all members to follow Public Health England's guidance.

Banqueting - Re-opening of Hall / Common Room

Hall is due to reopen on Monday 5th October, offering a new way to enjoy dining at the Inn. A lounge service will be available with a new menu, seating arrangements and opening hours and this facility will be open from 8am – 4pm Monday to Friday, offering breakfast options as well as lunch from the same hours of 12 Noon - 2:30pm. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day for people who do not want to have a full meal and guests will also be able to pre-order contactless and cash-free using a new app to be launched shortly. This will allow for bookings to be made in advance, as well as viewing menus, pre-ordering and payment. Wi-Fi will also be available for everyone who uses the lounge service in Hall.

Entry will be via the Benchers' Entrance and staff will be ensuring all physical distancing protocols are in place, including multiple sanitiser stations, a one-way system and their wearing of face masks.

With current Government guidelines enabling events to return from the beginning of October, the Banqueting Team are, as always, happy to discuss events you are planning, so please contact the team if you would like to enquire about Gray's Inn as a venue. New safety protocols, capacities and menus are in place, allowing for a safe return to hosting meetings and events.

Members and tenants of the Inn are eligible for a discount on venue hire, which until the end of 2020 is at an increased discounted rate. Library

From 1st September, the Library is open to members every day from 10:00am to 4:00pm. Saturday opening, on a rota basis with the other Inn Libraries, will also resume later this month, with Gray's Inn Library opening on Saturday 19th September. For further details, please see our <u>website</u>.

As the Library is now open every day, charges for our <u>Document Supply Service</u> have been reintroduced from 7th September. Please note that various measures have been introduced in line with government advice around COVID-19. Visitors to the Library are asked to wear a face covering and to sign-in on arrival. A one-way system is in operation and seating has been reduced to allow social distancing. Hand sanitiser and disinfectant wipes are available at intervals throughout the Library.

The Incorporated Council of Law Reporting for England and Wales, in partnership with the Inns of Court, is providing members of the Bar with free access to its online platform, ICLR Online, until 30th November 2020. All members are eligible to take up this offer.

Remote access log-ins for Bloomsbury Professional Online are still available. Archives

The Archive staff were furloughed between April and September and having returned to work are now dealing with the backlog of enquiries; the Archives continue to be closed for consultation of original material. The Inn has introduced a new software system called Preservica through which digital material will be archived and training to use it is underway.

Chapel

After a series of Audio Services available on the Inn's website, it was a joy to return to Chapel on the last Sunday before the Summer break, albeit with only two singers, a small congregation, and others taking part by Zoom.

Since then here has been some easing of restrictions: we can have a small choir but there's still no congregational singing, and we must observe social distancing. All Sunday services will also be live on Zoom until we're back to normal: for security reasons, the Zoom address will be issued by the Under Treasurer so please <u>email his office</u> in the week before each service.

Every two or three years we observe the first Sunday of the Michaelmas Term as a kind of Harvest Festival, and we'll be doing that when we return on 4th October. Then comes a Sung Eucharist for All Saints on 1st November, and the following week a Remembrance Sunday service beginning at the earlier time of 10:55am. The final Sunday morning service this term will be for Advent on 6th December. The October Call Day Evensong has been cancelled, and we will see nearer the time what's possible for a Carol Service on the afternoon of 20th December.

There will be the usual said half-hour Holy Communion on the first Tuesday of the month, but the current restrictions require that, as with the Sung Eucharist, it will be in one kind (bread only) and with social distancing.

During these past months we have lost three people, from different faith positions, but who all enjoyed coming to Chapel: Conrad Dehn, Julian Farrand and Brian Watkins. Their families have been in our prayers. Two weddings planned for this Summer have been postponed until next year, but another two may take place within the limitations now placed on us.

All services in Chapel are open to everyone, members, students and the general public. We're sorry that Sunday lunch is not currently available. The Chapel is also open every weekday when Hall is open for people to use for prayer and quiet reflection. Estates

Pedestrian & Vehicular Access

On 1st September the main vehicular and pedestrian gates to the Inn reopened on a pre-COVID regime i.e. opening at 6am and closing at 8pm with the exception of the entrance at 19/21 High Holborn which closes at midnight. Access and egress via this gate will be available on demand though the night as has been the case in the past. The main vehicular access to the Inn is through the 19/21 High Holborn gate with the exit for vehicles through the Gray's Inn Square archway onto Gray's Inn Road. Oversize vehicles are permitted to access through the Gray's Inn Square gate by prior arrangement. The Paddock gates remain closed other than for service vehicles.

The Porters' Lodge in the new building – One Gray's Inn (19/21 High Holborn) – is now operational. We will continue to staff the temporary Porters' Lodge in Gray's Inn Square until 2nd October to assist in managing traffic, etc.

Electric Vehicle Charging Posts

There are a limited number of electric vehicle charging posts at locations throughout the Inn. Take up of this facility has increased but a small number remain. They are available only to annual permit holders and enquiries should be made by email to <u>Kayanne Browne</u> or telephone: 0207 458 7814.

Storage Units

Basement storage units are available to let for personal or commercial use at rents starting from £100 per month. A short minimum term of three months applies. E-mail <u>Tim Bell</u> or telephone: 0207 458 7902.

Overnight Accommodation

The Overnight Accommodation has now reopened for new bookings and in addition to the flats offered at 10 South Square, a small number of flats are available for short lets from a minimum stay of 7 days up to a maximum of 3 months. Details can be obtained from <u>Tim Bell</u> on 0207 458 7902.

Two smaller residential apartments (a one bedroom and a two bedroom) will become available to rent towards the end of the month with two larger apartments likely to be available in the Autumn.
