Catering and Events Contract

The new Catering and Events Contract has been awarded to Ampersand and will come into effect from 1 January 2018. The current Baxter Storey staff will have the choice of transferring to Ampersand and we hope they all do.

Vehicle Access/Exit

During the work on One Gray's Inn (formerly 19/21 High Holborn) there will be <u>no vehicle access</u> from High Holborn nor into the Paddock (except for construction vehicles). Vehicle entrance/exit into Gray's Inn Square and South Square will be from Gray's Inn Road. Please note that traffic around Gray's Inn Square will move anti-clockwise.

Car Parking

Following the start of works at One Gray's Inn (formerly 19/21 High Holborn) the vehicular access from High Holborn has been closed. However, the <u>car parking</u> in both South Square and Gray's Inn Square remains available with access and egress via Gray's Inn Road. Daily car parking is available at a cost of £20 per day and there is no need to pre-book. The cost of annual parking permits, renewable on 1st January 2018, has been held for a further year at £2,760 per annum. Pedestrian Access

Please note that for reasons of safety due to the movement of two-way traffic through the Gray's Inn Road entrance/exit no pedestrian use of this entrance/exit will be permitted. Similarly, no pedestrian access via the Paddock will be permitted as it will be used for construction vehicles.

Electric Vehicle Charging Posts

There are now a number of electric vehicle charging posts at locations throughout the Inn. Take up of this opportunity has been encouraging. Spaces are available only to annual permit holders and a small number of spaces remain available. Library

As previously advised, all members may now borrow general textbooks (including old editions) and bound law reports or journals for either an hour during opening times or overnight from an hour before closing until an hour after opening. The service has proved popular and members are encouraged to take advantage of it.

Our Christmas opening hours can be found on the website, along with those of the other Inn Libraries.

Members can sign up to receive the <u>Library Bulletin</u>, issued periodically to keep Library users up to date with current opening hours, services and events. Previous bulletins can be accessed through the <u>Library Bulletin Archive</u>. Rolling Library news and information is also published via the Inn's <u>Twitter</u> and <u>Facebook</u> accounts. Our main <u>Contact Details</u> are available from the website, where you can also search the <u>Library Catalogue</u>.

Finally a reminder of our <u>Document Supply</u> and Remote Enquiry services for members who are unable to visit the Library in person, particularly those outside London. We are currently running a <u>promotion</u> until 31 January 2018, whereby your first item will be free of charge. Visit our website for full details about the service and our charges.

Modern Records

Preparation for the GDPR implementation in May 2018 continues by ensuring that all records in the archive, including the uncatalogued ones, have been assessed for personal data content.

The Inn's computer records are being examined in order to the compile a Data Asset Register. A similar process will be required of information on the paper records, which will also need to be more fully surveyed and included in the Data Asset Register prior to May 2018.

<u>The archives</u> have dealt with 132 external academic and historical enquiries plus an unquantified number from within the Inn, in addition to modern records enquiries, file retrievals and picture enquiries. The Hall windows' project that was undertaken for Master Hunt will be made available in the New Year. The work undertaken this year on the <u>history of women at the Bar</u>, largely available on the History section of the website, provides an invaluable platform for a larger project on the same subject for 2019, the centenary of the principle legislation on the equality of women.

Dr Daniel Gosling, the Assistant Archivist in training, has given a number of academic presentations on legal historical subjects and is working on a number of academic publications. He has also provided an historical commentary for a TV programme on Charles Dickens and the Inn. Copyright in images and archives and permissions to publish, digitisation of the accounts volumes, publication of the 19th-century Pension minutes are all ongoing.

Pictures and Works of Art

A portrait of the late Revd Roger Holloway (by the artist Simon Menzies) has been presented to the Inn by his son, Adam Holloway MP, and has been hung in the Chapel Corridor.
