#### **Archives**

The Bertha Cave display in the Chapel lobby has received favourable comment. From this month, located inside the Student Entrance to Hall and the Benchers' Entrance to Domus, we are displaying details of distinguished woman of the Inn, the first of them to be Dame Rose Heilbron DBE QC. These will change each month up to December 2020.

New paintings now hanging in the Inn include the portrait of Master Etherton by Keith Breeden and the hypothetical portrait of Thomas Middleton by John Afflick presented by Master Shuttleworth.

## Chapel

In our new pattern of services, we now have Choral Mattins once a month during legal terms, plus two Sung Eucharists and a Festive Mattins in the Summer. In addition to the termly Evensong we have introduced a shorter Evensong on Call Days.

This month we marked the start of Advent with Mattins on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> December. The annual service of Nine Lessons and Carols will be on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> December at 3.00pm. If you wish to stay for tea after the service, please can you book online so that we know how many to cater for.

In the New Year we have Choral Mattins at 11.15am on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 16<sup>th</sup> February, 8<sup>th</sup> March and 5<sup>th</sup> April (Palm Sunday).

Evensong will be sung at 6.00pm on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> February. Holy Communion – a simple half hour service from the Book of Common Prayer – will be celebrated at 6.00pm on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> February and on 26<sup>th</sup> February (Ash Wednesday).

Our annual "Words & Music" evening will be on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> April, the day 425 years ago when Henry Walpole was martyred. He is, we think, the only member of Gray's who has been made a saint. Please book online for Supper afterwards.

All services in Chapel are open to everyone, members, students and the general public. Please book online or contact Michelle Clark if you want to stay for lunch after the Sunday services. The Chapel is also open every weekday when Hall is open for people to use for prayer and quiet reflection.

#### **Estates**

#### **Vehicle Access/Exit**

Although the redevelopment of One Gray's Inn (formerly 19/21 High Holborn) is nearing completion, the necessary traffic arrangements must remain in place. There is no vehicle access from High Holborn, nor into the Paddock from Gray's Inn Road (except for construction vehicles). Vehicular access and egress for Gray's Inn Square and South Square will continue to be from Gray's Inn Road through the gate adjacent to the pedestrian crossing. Please note that traffic around Gray's Inn Square moves anticlockwise. As soon as we have a firm date for the reopening of the entrance from High Holborn for vehicles, we will notify the Inn separately. At that point, the Security team will move from the portacabin in Gray's Inn Square to the One Gray's Inn.

### Car Parking

Although the access arrangements are different, car parking facilities are still available throughout the estate in Gray's Inn Square and adjacent to the Verulam and Raymond Buildings terraces. Daily car parking is available at a cost of £20 per day and there is no need to pre-book. A half day rate of £10 is available but only in the afternoon when parking after 1pm; there are no concessions. tickets are due for renewal on 1st January 2020 and charges will remain the same other than for residents where a phased increase over a period of 5 years is being implemented.

#### **Pedestrian Access**

Please note that for reasons of safety due to the movement of two-way traffic through the Gray's Inn Road entrance/exit there is no pedestrian use of this entrance/exit. Similarly, no pedestrian access via the Paddock is possible as it is being used by construction vehicles. This arrangement will remain in place until the entrance is re-opened for vehicle access from High Holborn.

#### **Electric Vehicle Charging Posts**

There are a number of electric vehicle charging posts at locations throughout the Inn. Take up of this facility has been good but a small number remain. They are available only to annual permit holders and enquiries should be made by email to <u>Kayanne Browne</u> or telephone: 0207 458 7814.

#### **Storage Units**

Basement storage units are available to let for personal or commercial use at rents starting from £100 per month. A short minimum term of three months applies. E-mail <u>Tim Bell</u> or telephone: 0207 458 7902.

#### Overnight Accommodation

In addition to the overnight accommodation offered at 10 South Square, a small number of flats are available for short lets from a minimum stay of 7 days up to a maximum of 3 months. One provides 1 bedroom accommodation, another 3 bedrooms and the largest is 4 bedrooms. Details can be obtained from <u>Tim Bell</u> on 0207 458 7902.
